For our class, dress in layers wearing long sleeve cotton shirts and pants, closed toed leather shoes, a cap or bandana and a jacket for the chilly mornings. Bring clothes you won't mind getting dirty or burning small holes in. For obvious reasons we don't recommend the use of hair spray, aftershave, perfume, bug spray and other accelerants. People always admire our outfits at every meal.

Your eye and ear protectors, gloves, aprons, Oxy/acetylene and mig welders, plasma cutter, power grinders and steel saws, scrap metals and personal work stations are provided. Bring any gear like leather work gloves that fit properly and metal you desire.

The welding studio is set up in Longhouse near the Box Canyon trail head. This amazing secluded space allows us to be as loud and obnoxious as only welders can be without distractions and it's only a few minutes walk to the dining hall.

Working hours are from 9 to 5 Monday through Wednesday with breaks for rest and lunch. Thursday we work until noon to finish up our pieces and after lunch clean up the work stations and get ready for the evening art show. After the show, plan to take your art pieces with you unless you have sold them to an admirer.

Check in at the office when you arrive. We look forward to meeting with you at 6:45 Sunday after dinner briefly for orientation and getting acquainted. You will be ready to 'FIRE IT UP' on Monday morning.
